In keeping with the district policy of making student activities financially self-sufficient, our school board has adopted a participation fee for all major activities.

On the back of this sheet is a list showing the participation fee for all athletics, plus debate, drama, vocal and instrumental music.

Student athletes must have parental consent, insurance, a physical examination and agree to conditions involving training rules and conduct before participating at Herriman High.

To register for any activity, each student will receive a packet of materials from their coach or advisor. You must complete and include you and your parents' signature on the following forms:

- (1) Activities Participation Agreement
- (2) Parental Consent Form
- (3) Insurance Waiver
- (4) Anti-Hazing Agreement
- (5) A Doctor's signature on the physical examination form
- (6) UHSAA Tryout Checklist.

Upon completion of these forms, the entire packet must be returned to the main office at which time the student will pay their activity fee. After paying their fee, the student will receive a copy of their fee receipt. This receipt should be stapled to the packet and left with the office secretary. After this procedure has been completed, the student athlete is eligible to participate.

ACTIVITIES PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

Many opportunities are provided for students to develop their talents while representing the school in competitive activities. These opportunities are provided at the discretion of the school, and it is not a right but a privilege for students to participate. Consequently, this agreement has been drawn so that the student and his/her parent(s) will be fully aware of their individual responsibilities. If a student or his/her parent(s) refuse to accept the responsibilities which are listed below, the student's privilege to participate in the activities will not be granted.

1. **UHSAA Guidelines:** A student must meet residence and other requirements as set forth by the UHSAA.
2. **Scholastic Requirements:** In order to be eligible scholastically to compete in UHSAA sponsored activities, a student must meet two criteria: (1) he/she may not be failing more than one class, or have failed more than one class the previous grading period, and (2) he/she must have earned at least a 2.0 grade point average the previous grading period.
3. **Use or Possession of Tobacco, Drugs, or Alcoholic Beverages:** A student is not to use these substances. If it is learned that a student is using or has possessed tobacco, drugs or alcohol, a hearing will be held. If the student has indeed been in possession of or has used tobacco, drugs or alcohol during a season of participation, he/she may be declared ineligible to participate for the remainder of the season.
4. **Behavior:** The following are some examples of behavior that may lead to loss of eligibility: (1) insolence, insubordination or disrespect of any kind to a Herriman High School staff member, (2) sluffing classes or activities such as assemblies where attendance is required, (3) rowdy or disruptive behavior in the building, (4) theft of personal or public property while at school, (5) destruction of, defacing, or vandalizing school property. If a student violates any of these rules of behavior, a hearing will be held. The length of loss of eligibility will be determined by the seriousness of the offence.
5. **Sportsmanship:** Participants and parents will treat officials and other participants with dignity and respect, and behave in a sportsmanlike manner while participating and/or observing activities.
6. **Violence:** We recognize that in contact sports, some injuries are inevitable, but a participant will not act in such a way as to deliberately cause harm to his/her opponents. There is no place for violence in high school athletic programs.

7. **Profanity:** The use of profane and obscene language by any student is unacceptable behavior and will not be tolerated.
8. **Dress and Grooming :**(1) All students must maintain their hair in a clean, well groomed and properly-trimmed manner. (2) Student will not be allowed to wear clothes which are mutilated or immodest such as hot pants, halter tops, tank tops, pants with holes, shirts which expose a bare midriff or other similar attire.(3) Shoes will be worn at all times. (4) Jackets and clothing with insignias representing the armed forces of our country or insignias that do not reflect the dignity of learning, modesty and the principles of education are not to be worn. This includes T-shirts which display any kind suggestive picture or *saying*.(5) School officials may require students to wear certain types of clothing for health reasons in connection with certain specialized activities.
9. **A STUDENT MUST BE COVERED BY HEALTH /ACCIDENT INSURANCE. INSURED THROUGH:** _____
10. **1st Quarter Eligibility:** A student must make eligibility during 4th Quarter for all fall sports. This affects football, volleyball, swimming, girls' soccer, girls' tennis, cross country, golf and drill.

PARENT PERMISSION FOR ACTIVITY PARTICIPATION

1. Before a student is allowed to participate in the Herriman High School activity program this permission form must be signed for each activity on file with the school.
2. The school district is relieved of any or all liability for injuries connected in any way with the competitive athletic program.
3. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to provide insurance protection for the athlete while he or she is participating in competitive activities.
4. The school district makes available a student insurance plan which offers good coverage for any accident or injury resulting from participation. This plan is available each fall for a nominal fee.
5. Occasionally your son or daughter may travel to practice or a scheduled activity event in student driven cars. If you object to this procedure, please notify our athletic director in writing. A parent permission form will be secured before the activity.
6. Although participation in supervised school athletics and activities programs is among the least hazardous activities in which any student will engage either in or out of school, the very nature of these school athletic and activities programs does create potential for injury. Parents should be aware that the chance of injury is present while students are participating in school athletics and activities. Those parents who do not wish to expose their students to this possibility should not sign this permission form.

Anti-Hazing Agreement

Hazing occurs when an act is substance that subjects the student to an unreasonable risk of physical harm.

3. Any activity involving actions of a sexual nature or the simulation of actions of a sexual nature.
4. Any activity that subjects a student to an extreme and unreasonable level of embarrassment, shame, or humiliation or which creates a hostile, abusive, and intimidating environment for the student.
5. Any activity involving any violation of federal, state, or local law or any violation of district, school, and athletic department policies and regulations.

Discipline: Athletes, coaches, advisors, or students are responsible to report any of the above violations to any member of the HHS Administration or the Athletic Director. Improper behavior as described above committed against a student or a student is coerced into committing an act that creates a substantial risk of harm to the student or to any third party in order for the student to be initiated into or affiliated with any school activity or organization. Hazing includes but is not limited to:

1. Any activity involving an unreasonable risk of physical harm including paddling, beating, whipping, branding, electric shock, sleep deprivation, exposure to weather, placement of harmful substances on the body, and participation in physically dangerous activities.
2. Any activity involving the consumption of alcohol, drugs, tobacco products, or any other food, liquid, or other may lead to the loss of a student's participation privileges.
