

# Final Report Summary 2014-2015 School Land Trust

## Expenditures:

\$113,080	Salaries and Employee Benefits

1-Money was set aside to provide assistance to provisional teachers to give them extra training and mentoring.

- Provisionary teachers, (1-3 years of experience), will be given extra training through our Herriman Institute for Teachers, (HIT) program. Which pays for professional development and mentoring.
- Additional support will be given through Herriman’s Professional Learning Communities, (PLCs), and by paying for substitutes to cover classes so inexperienced teachers could observe master teachers not only at Herriman but throughout the entire district.

2-Money was set aside to help students that are struggling academically and to prepare for ACT.

- Land Trust money will be used to pay teachers and counselors outside of the contract day to teach ACT prep classes.
- Tutoring will be provided during the week after school for students needing help in English, Math, and Science.

3-Eight extra periods were paid for out of land trust for study skills classes.

4-126 Google Chromebooks were purchased to be used in 3 mobile labs.

## Progress made last year:

The PLAN test is given to the sophomore class in the fall. It measures a baseline of where our sophomore class is at the beginning of their high school career. Academic improvement was static or slightly lower across the board.

The ACT is given at the end of the junior year. We are encouraged by the growth in our scores over the last 4 years and the increase in our scores in every area.

In only our second year of SAGE testing we have seen a great improvement of proficient students in every academic area. The lowest increase was 8% in English 11, while the biggest jump was 16% in Chemistry
