

Schedule Plan: You must select enough classes to fill 8 periods for the whole year, using a combination of year-long and semester long classes.

Use this check list to make sure you have selected the correct classes.

1. A Language Arts class is required each year.

Language Arts 10 (sophomores)	Lang Arts 10 or honors
Language Arts 11 (juniors)	Language Arts 11, honors or AP English Language
*Language Arts 12 (seniors)	Language Arts 12, AP Literature, World Language 3 or higher
* Seniors may substitute 2 semester long Language Arts elective classes and or Concurrent English classes (you must qualify for concurrent) to satisfy the full credit	

2. A Social Studies class is required each year.

World History (sophomores)	World History, AP World History, or AP European History
U.S. History (juniors)	U.S. History, AP U.S. History, Concurrent U.S. History
Government (seniors)- Semester only	U.S. Government, AP Government- year-long

3. Math should be taken 3 years for Graduation. If you are college bound-take a math class your senior year for elective credit. *Additional math classes may be year-long or semester*

Secondary Math 2 , Secondary Math 2 Honors
Secondary Math 3 , Secondary Math 3 Honors
Additional math for college preparation: College Prep, Pre-Calc, AP Calculus, AP Stats, or Concurrent Math classes (you must qualify for concurrent) (<i>Math for Life Decisions may be taken to meet high school graduation requirements senior year</i>)

4. Science should be taken for 3 years for Graduation. *Additional Science classes may be taken for elective credit.* (Chemistry and Physics use math skills to complete assignments)

Biology , AP Biology, Biology 1010/1015
Chemistry , Honors Chemistry
Physics , Honors Physics- (may take the AP Physics I exam)
Other Science: Medical Anatomy/Physiology, Wildlife Biology, Bio Agriculture, Earth, Animal Science Semester long Science: Zoology, Astronomy,

- 5-8. The remaining classes may be selected from the following:

Digital Studies- Business Office, Computer Science, Web Design, Computer Programming
Financial Lit
Fine Art Classes- Art, Music, Dance, Film Studies, Photography
CTE Classes- Business, Family/Consumer Science, Trade/Industry, Health Sciences
Health & PE Classes- Fitness for Life (10 th grade), Weights, Sports themed, Dance, Yoga, Exercise Science, Health Sciences
World Language: Spanish, French, Chinese, American Sign Language (World Language classes are year-long)
JATC Programs — These classes usually fill 4 periods a day (4 credits)
Elective Classes-
Seminary/Release Time- This class fills a period but does not earn credit towards graduation.

(check to see if your selected classes are semester or year-long to make sure you fill your schedule with 8 classes each semester)
